The Board of County Commissioners met at 10 o'clock A. M. this day pursuant to the recess of yesterday and the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

This being the day set for hearing on the proposed herd district in Twp. 18 N. 3 E. S. M. and no appearing before the Board to protest the granting of said district and it appearing to the Board that all requirements of the statutes regarding the organization of herd districts have been complied with, it was therefore ordered that the petition of Guy Fairbrother, et al., be granted as prayed for, and that 30 days after date of this order and thereafter it shall be unlawful for any horses, mules, asses, cattle, swine, sheep or goats, to be herded or permitted to run at large on the public highways within the boundaries of the following described district: Beginning at the S. W. Corner of the S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 33, Township 18 N. R. 3 E. S. M., thence north one and one fourth mile, thence East one fourth mile to the N. E. corner of the S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 28, thence North of the Corporation line of the Town of McCall, thence westerly along said corporation line to the Payette River, thence in a southwesterly direction along Payette River to the North line of Section 30, thence West on Section line to the Adams County line, thence in a Southerly direction along said county line to the township line between townships 17 and 18, thence East on said township line to place of beginning.

The Petition of W. B. Boydston et al. asking for a herd district is hereby granted according to the boundaries described as follows:

W. B. Boydston
Sept. 15, 1920

Beginning at the N.E. corner of Lot 3, Sec. 8, T. 18 N., R. 3 E. B.M. near the mouth of Payette Lake and following the West bank of Payette River in a South-westerly direction to the South line of center Section 25 in T. 18 N. R. 2 E. B.M. thence West about two and one eighth miles to the County line, thence in a northeasterly direction along said County line to the North line Section 29, T. 19 N. R. 3 E. thence East about one mile to the shore of Payette Lake, thence following said Lake shore in a Southerly direction to place of beginning. It will be unlawful for cattle, sheep or hogs to run at large or be herded in the lanes of the boundaries of the said district, between the first day of April and the 1st day of November of each year.

The petition of John W. Brown and others asking to be released from the consolidation of the district known as Roseberry District was disapproved by the Board of County Commissioners.

The petition of the petitioners of School Districts Nos. 54, 42, 48, 37, 4 and 18 to be consolidated and united to constitute one School District, the boundaries being as follows:

Beginning at the west boundary line of Valley County, in section three township 17 N. R. 2 E., thence following the meanderings of the County line between Adams & Valley Counties in a southerly direction to the S. E. corner section 14 township 16 N. 2 E., thence east to the S. E. corner section 18 township 16 N. 3 E., thence following the meanderings of the North Fork of the Payette River in a southerly direction to a point where the east and west half section line crosses section 16 on the east bank of the North Fork of the Payette River in township 15 N. 3 E., thence east on this half section line to the east side line of township 15 N. 5 E., where this half section line crosses section 13 township 15 N. 5 E. thence North to the N. E. corner section 1 township 16 N. 5 E., thence west to the point where the township line between townships 16 N and 17 N. intersects Lake Fork Creek, thence north following the meanderings of Lake Fork Creek to the N. E. corner of section 21 township 17 N. 3 E., thence west for one and one half miles to the center of section 20; thence north to the center of section

at 10 O'Clock A.M. this day as a Board of County Commissioners this being the time set for the setting of the date for the hearing of the petition of Ed. Core and others praying for the organization of an irrigation district to be known as Lake Work Irrigation District.

All in township 17 N. R. 3 East S.M. and that the remonstrance of Matt Ruatsala and other against the creation of said district be and the same is hereby denied.

R.M. Burnham having filed a protest with the Board of County Commissioners of Valley County protesting against a certain notice having been posted on property of M.E. Lewis which he has charge of, setting forth that the squirrels must be poisoned on the property, and it appearing to the Board of Commissioners that said notice might be wrongfully posted. It is ordered that the Clerk of this Board notify Earnest Holt that he be restrained from poisoning said lands and filing a claim for the same until he appear before the Board and show his reasons for so doing.

It is ordered that a current expense warrant in the amount \$25.00 be drawn in favor of R.B. Halferty for the care of John Cole.

It is ordered that the amount of \$100.00 be appropriated from the County Road Fund for the repair of the Road from Knox to Cabin Creek Summit.

In the matter of the petition of R. B. Helferty, et al, asking that a herd district be created in Valley County to be bounded and described as follows:

Commencing at the North West corner of Section 16, Twp. 17 N., R. 7 E. S. 4 W., running thence south along the Range line to the point of intersection with the Fayette River, thence along the West bank of said river to the point of intersection of Gold Fork Creek with the Fayette River and follow the North bank of Gold Fork Creek to the East line of Section 24, Township 16 N., R. 7 E. S. 4 W., thence North along the Range line to the North east corner of Section 17, Twp. 17 N. R. 7 E. S. 4 W., thence East to the Place of beginning.

It appearing to the Board that said petition was duly and regularly filed with the Valley County Board on April 8, 1918, that a date for hearing on said petition was set for May 14, 1918; that on said date the hearing was had and thereafter on the same date an order was made and entered on the minutes of the meeting granting the petition and creating the herd district as petitioned. It further appearing to the Board that thru neglect or oversight, no date was set for the order to take effect, as required by Sec. 24-2404, Idaho Code, 1907, THEREFORE, on motion of Commissioner Mahoney, duly seconded by Commissioner McBride, and upon advise of the County Attorney, based on an opinion from the office of the Attorney General, it was unanimously voted to enter an order as of this date confirming the creation of said herd district and setting the date of January 15, 1950 for the order creating the district to take effect.

This being the time set for hearing on the petition of A. L. Roberts, et al, asking that a herd district be created out of certain lands in Twp. 16 N. R. 3 E. B.M. and it appearing to the Board that due and legal notice of such hearing has been given and no persons appearing to protest the granting of said petition, it was ordered that the petition be granted and a herd district created, the boundaries of which are as follows:

Commencing at the northeast corner of the Herd District heretofore established on the south side of the Gold Fork River, Valley County, Idaho, including the Bratton, Loomis, and other places, which said corner is near the south end of the Gold Fork River Bridge on the State Highway running between Cascade and Donnelly, Idaho, and thence running in an easterly direction along the south bank of said Gold Fork River to the east boundary line of the county road leading south from Roseberry, Idaho; thence south along said east boundary line of said highway to the Northwest corner of the southwest quarter of Sec. 36, Twp. 16 North, Range 3 East, 4.E.; thence east three-quarters of a mile; thence south three-quarters of a mile; thence west to the east boundary line of the established herd district heretofore mentioned; thence north along the east boundary of said established herd district to the point of beginning.

Whereupon October 12, 1927, was fixed as the date upon which said order should take effect and thereafter it shall be unlawful for any persons to permit horses, mules, asses, cattle, swine, sheep or goats to run at large or be herded on the highways within the boundaries of said district.
