- ❖ Spotted Knapweed Perennial Introduced & Noxious
  - Composite seedhead with \_\_\_\_\_ flowers.
  - Distinct "spots"

- Salt Cedar Perennial Introduced & Noxious
   green or blue-green foliage.
  - White to pink flowers that bloom in clusters along tips of stems.
  - Deciduous



- Juniper Perennial Native
  Leaves look like are overlapping \_\_\_\_\_\_.
  Berry-like fruit that is typically bright \_\_\_\_\_\_ (often covered with a white coating).
  - Evergreen
